**AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC GOOD (“CPG”)
ISSUED PURSUANT TO 30 V.S.A. SECTION 248**

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) this day found and adjudged that an amendment to the CPG entered on January 22, 2018, and amended on February 16, 2018, in Case No. 17-2813-PET authorizing the construction and operation of the GMP Panton Battery Storage Project (the “Project”) by Green Mountain Power Corporation (“CPG Holder”) at Panton Road in Panton, Vermont, in accordance with the evidence and plans submitted in this proceeding in support of the CPG Holder’s July 15, 2020, motion for a non-substantial change determination or in the alternative an amendment to its certificate of public good, will promote the general good of the State. Accordingly, the CPG entered on January 22, 2018, and amended on February 16, 2018, in Case No. 17-2813-PET is amended as follows:

1. Site preparation, construction, operation, and maintenance of the Project shall be in accordance with the plans and evidence submitted in Case No. 17-2813-PET, and as superseded by the plans and evidence submitted in support of the CPG Holder’s July 15, 2020, motion for a non-substantial change determination or in the alternative an amendment to its certificate of public good. Any material deviation from these plans or a substantial change to the Project must be approved by the Commission. Failure to obtain advance approval from the Commission for a material deviation from the approved plans or a substantial change to the Project may result in the assessment of a penalty pursuant to 30 V.S.A. §§ 30 and 247.

2. The CPG Holder shall file with the Commission within six months of its initial implementation of the islanding function a report detailing the results of its initial implementation, including any unforeseen failures and costs, its expected timeline for expansion of the islanding function, the number of customers it expects to serve with that function and the schedule under which they will be served, and the trajectory of expected economic benefits that will result from that expansion.




3. If the expansion of the islanding function to the larger customer group described in Kirk Shields' affidavit cannot be achieved based on the \$628,000 estimate in that affidavit, then the CPG Holder must immediately file with the Commission detailed information on any anticipated increased costs and must do so before it begins installation of the new equipment associated with the proposed changes.

4. The CPG Holder shall not begin any site preparation, construction, or other activity on the Project site that violates Governor Scott's Executive Order 01-20 or any addenda to that order. These orders are further described in guidance issued by the Agency of Commerce and Community Development, available at <https://accd.vermont.gov/covid-19/business/stay-home-stay-safe-sector-specific-guidance>.

5. This Amendment to the CPG shall not be transferred without prior approval of the Commission.


